THEME FOR 2010

The theme for the new year 2010 is HOPE. We believe that it is a timely topic for our upcoming retreats, because one does not need to be terribly observant to realize that there is much information in the news and magazines which is anything but encouraging and hopeful. Yet at the very same time there are many things that are happening which are very hopeful indeed. What is needed is attention to the positive signs and there are many. What these are and how we can benefit from them will be part of our retreats. The tendency to see everything as hopeless or negative is not helpful to anyone, nor is it the truth. We have many **reasons to be hopeful** in the future of the world, the Church, the younger generation, and our own future.

Our main reason for hope, evidently, is God's word and promise as made known to us by Jesus. He clearly said that we are infinitely loved by God, and God will not allow us and the wonder of His beautiful creation to be destroyed and wasted. All may change and be transformed with time. Jesus said, "**All is made new,**" and "**I will be with you until the end of the ages.**" What are some of the signs that his words are true? We will speak of them during our retreats in the coming months.

One of my favorite texts on Hope is one by Ladislaus Boros, S.J. in his small book entitled "**Living in Hope.**" Boros helps us to realize that even the gift of our five senses are reasons for Hope. In a section of the book where he reflects on the resurrection of the body, he writes, "**we will no longer be strangers to God.** We will become the expression of the experience of immediate contact with God. We shall "hear," "taste" and "touch" God. God will be wholly present in human life. What does that mean? Since God is present everywhere, it means that in some sense we also will be "boundless." This leads us to the third characteristic of the risen human being. We will know no more narrow limits. Everything spiritual will overflow into the senses and the latter into the former. Sight will become direct **knowledge**, touch will be **recognition**, and hearing will be **understanding**. The limits of space will disappear. We will at once exist wherever our love, desire and happiness attract us. Human life in the state of resurrection will therefore be wholly "spirit," but that spirituality will simultaneously include that sweetness and joyous quality which derives from the earthly character of our senses. Can any of us honestly say that we should really wish eternally to be deprived of what the sight of a field of flowers, the embrace of a beloved person and the sound of a beautiful voice mean to us? The message of the resurrection is the most human of all that Christianity has announced to humankind."

Therefore, let us have faith and hope! If such a promise is true about our senses, what does God have in mind for each of us and for the world, for the Church and for what seems like hopeless situations in the world? Yes there is hope! We have every reason to look forward to the future and the fulfillment of God's promises. **Isn't it exciting?**

Prayer Shawl Ministry

The **prayer shawl ministry**, as we know it, was created by **Vicki Galo and Janet Bristow** after they completed a Women’s Leadership Institute in 1998. Individuals **come together** to knit or crochet a prayer shawl either **for an individual’s lap or shoulders**. Before a session begins, each person **prays for the man, woman or child** who will be the recipient. At the end of the session, each person present offers a **prayer over every shawl** that is being created. When completed, a card will be attached. Each card will have a **picture** of the La Salette Retreat House, a **prayer** and the **signature** of the person whose fingers lovingly created the shawl.

When several shawls have been completed a Mass will be celebrated during which they will be **blessed**. The group will determine **how** they will be **distributed** ... either to someone who is seriously ill or celebrating a special occasion; to someone who is transitioning into a new phase of life or welcoming a new member into the family; to someone who is homeless, homebound or in a nursing home, etc. Because the ministry is rooted in prayer, shawl creators truly **encircle the lives** of those who will wear them.

Pastoral Counseling at the Retreat Center

At one time or another along our life journey, we face difficulties and struggles that may at times, seem unsurmountable. Depression, anxiety, trauma, sexual abuse, stress, a life-threatening illness, life crises and transitions, loss of meaning and purpose, loss of a significant relationship through death or divorce, loss of a job - any of these can leave us feeling overwhelmed, lost, confused, in pain. At times, we don't know where to turn. We look for a way out, and find ourselves wandering in darkness. We look for answers; there are none.

During these difficult times, we may benefit from engaging in Pastoral Counseling, with a professional trained to accompany us through our pain and struggle.

A Pastoral Counselor is a psychotherapist trained in both psychology and spirituality. Pastoral counseling focuses on the whole person engaged in life's journey. The Pastoral Counselor helps you move through your emotional issues, life crises and pain in view of living a more integrated and balanced life. In this process, you become more reflective about your life, which fosters your ability to make life-giving choices and decisions in harmony with your deepest self. Gradually, you come to a clearer sense of who you are as a human being in the world at this time, engaged in a dynamic relationship with yourself, others and God.

- live a more integrated and balanced life

RECOMMENDED READING

“The Synoptic Gospels Set Free”
Preaching Without Anti-Judaism
by Daniel Harrington, S.J. A Stimulus Book 2009
Paulist Press, N.Y., Mahwah, N.J.

Daniel Harrington, S.J., a Professor of New Testament at Boston College School of Theology and Ministry, has written another masterful book to help us understand the Gospels of Matthew, Mark and Luke in their original context. He writes for preachers, and religious educators, as well as any adult with a special interest in the Scripture. He writes, “In this book my goal is to approach in a positive and constructive way those Synoptic Gospel texts that seem most troublesome in relationships between Jews and Christians today. I want to show that when read in their first century Jewish context, problematic passages often turn out to be more intelligible and less likely to foster anti-Judaism.” (p.1)

Each Gospel is treated in a separate section, and looks at the Who, When, Where - Why, What, How - Major Themes of each Gospel - and asks: Is Matthew (or Mark or Luke) Anti-Jewish? Then specific episodes of each Gospel are examined and the author indicates when the specific episodes are read in the Liturgical year, and in what cycle of readings they are proclaimed.

I have found this book to be most enlightening in my own understanding of the texts the author reflects on - a real treasure trove for my own prayer, reflection and preaching. I feel certain that religious educators and anyone seriously interested in the Scripture would benefit from a prayerful reading of this volume.

This book on the Synoptic Gospels is a companion volume to an earlier and similar book written by Fr. George M. Smigas’s “The Gospel of John Set Free.”

The book is a real gift to all who seek to know Jesus more deeply, more intimately, and the times in which he lived and taught. May it be so for all who read and pray its contents.
